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DEMAT



A critical tool for maximizing your wealth and safekeeping, Demat accounts make share trading quick and easy. It eliminates the risks and challenges associated with physical share certificates. In India, if you wish to invest in the stock market, it is mandatory to open Demat account.

Earlier, shares were held in a physical form through share certificates. However, it made the entire process of share trading cumbersome and difficult to carry out at short notice.

With a Demat account, you can hold a wide variety of investments such as bonds, equity shares, government securities, mutual funds, and exchange-traded funds (ETFs). Similar to a bank account, a Demat account is either credited or debited each time you buy or sell shares of a company.

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ETF



An exchange-traded fund (ETF) is a pooled investment security that can be bought and sold like an individual stock. ETFs can be structured to track anything from the price of a commodity to a large and diverse collection of securities.

ETFs can even be designed to track specific investment strategies. Various types of ETFs are available to investors for income generation, speculation, and price increases, and to hedge or partly offset risk in an investor's portfolio. An exchange-traded fund (ETF) is a basket of securities that trades on an exchange just like a stock does.

ETF share prices fluctuate all day as the ETF is bought and sold; this is different from mutual funds, which only trade once a day after the market closes.

ETFs offer low expense ratios and fewer broker commissions than buying the stocks individually.

STOCKS



A stock, also known as equity, is a security that represents the <u>ownership of a fraction</u> of the issuing corporation. Units of stock are called shares, which entitle the owner to a proportion of the corporation's assets and profits equal to how much stock they own.

Stocks are bought and sold predominantly on stock exchanges and are the foundation of many individual investors' portfolios. Stock trades have to conform to government regulations meant to protect investors from fraudulent practices.

A stock is a form of security that indicates the holder has proportionate ownership in the issuing corporation and is sold predominantly on stock exchanges.

Corporations issue stock to raise funds to operate their businesses.

There are two main types of stock: common and preferred.

Historically, stocks have outperformed most other investments over the long run.

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DERIVATIVE



The term derivative refers to a type of financial contract whose value is dependent on an <u>underlying asset</u>, group of assets, or benchmark. A derivative is set between two or more parties that can trade on an exchange or <u>over-the-counter</u> (OTC).

Derivatives are financial contracts, set between two or more parties, that derive their value from an underlying asset, group of assets, or benchmark.

A derivative can trade on an exchange or over-the-counter.

Prices for derivatives derive from fluctuations in the underlying asset.

Derivatives are usually leveraged instruments, which increases their potential risks and rewards.

Common derivatives include futures contracts, forwards, options, and swaps.
